## Initiative Spotlight: Advancing AI Literacy

The AI Action Team hosted **two AI Literacy sessions, engaging 103 participants** from industry, education, and the community. 


## Initiative Spotlight: Engineers Week




## Initiative Spotlight: 2-Year NREM Degree

Expanding access to local pathways in Natural Resources and Environmental Management

The NRSP identified the need for a 2-year Natural Resources and Environmental Management (NREM) degree to provide a **clearer pathway** from the UH Community Colleges to NREM at UH Manoa. The UH Community Colleges, UH Manoa, and Kupu collaborated to develop a new Associate in Science - Natural Sciences NREM concentration, which launched in Fall 2025 at **Kapi'olani and Windward Community Colleges**. This new degree program creates a more accessible and streamlined pathway from local high schools to the CCs to NREM at UH Manoa.



## Natural Resources Career Posters

Improving awareness of Hawaii's diverse natural resources management careers

The Career Awareness action team created and distributed posters to over **250 local educators** to **showcase the diversity of natural resources management careers** in Hawaii to local educators, students, and their families. The posters have been shared with middle and high schools statewide, and the partnership is currently adapting the posters for elementary schools.

## Initiative Spotlight: Hawaii Youth Apprenticeship Network

Preparing Hawaii's next generation of seafarers

Launching in Fall 2026, the **HYAN Maritime Pre-Apprenticeship Program** aims to empower Hawaii's youth to navigate high-wage, high-demand maritime careers. Through hands-on learning, certifications, and cultural connection to the ocean, **students gain the skills needed to launch their careers, advance into registered apprenticeships, or continue their journey into college and beyond.**



## Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum: Aviation Pathways
